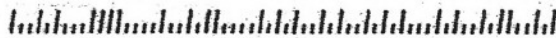

It is with great pleasure that I write today to inform you that George Mason University's Part B petition for a Phi Kappa Phi chapter has been evaluated and approved. The next step in the petitioning process is the Campus Visit.

Typically, the visit is scheduled for either a Sunday evening through noon Tuesday or Wednesday evening through noon on Friday. The two-member Phi Kappa Phi team will include the region's representative, or another board member, and me. The objectives of this visit are


- To determine institution commitment to the projected chapter;
- To build partnership between the petitioning group, board and Headquarters staff;
- To inform/educate regarding Phi Kappa Phi that all might be knowledgeable about and advocates for the Society.

Campus Visits generally begin with an unhurried session with the petitioning group on Sunday/Wednesday evening. Monday/Thursday's schedule calls for a full day of meeting with Tuesday/Friday being but a half day. A sample schedule is enclosed for you to use as a model.

It is vitally important to have 30-45 minutes with your president and chief academic officer. I cannot overestimate the importance of their support of the chapter in its early precedent setting years. Equally important is an opportunity to meet with the Council of Deans or whatever that body might be called at your school. We shall need no more than 20 minutes for that session.

We are eager to hear back from you that we might schedule a September visit. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me or Mrs. Landry.
